

May the Lord give you peace!

January always seems to be so dark, even though we are now past the shortest day of the season and the days are slowly getting longer. The coldest days of the winter are also usually in January. Let's admit it; we'd just rather sleep through January. However, January is a bright spot in the liturgical calendar.

If you read through the two verses of the hymn above, you might notice a common thread. That common thread is the manifestation of the Son of God.

1 Songs of thankfulness and praise, Jesus, Lord, to you we raise, manifested by the star to the Magi from afar, branch of royal David's stem, in your birth at Bethlehem. Anthems be to you addressed, God in man made manifest.

2 Manifest at Jordan's stream, Prophet, Priest, and King supreme, and at Cana, wedding guest, in your Godhead manifest; manifest in pow'r divine, changing water into wine. Anthems be to you addressed, God in man made manifest.

This hymn goes back to a time when three manifestations were celebrated together. Let's look at them.

The first manifestation is Epiphany, when we recall the visit of the Magi (wise men from the East). Historically, Epiphany preceded the observance of the Nativity. According to Luke 2, the shepherds in the fields near Bethlehem (Jews) received the first invitation to see the newborn Messiah. In Matthew 1, the Magi (Gentiles) also received one. The Savior is for all people, not just a few.

The second manifestation is the Baptism of the Lord. The manifestation isn't the baptism itself but the voice that reveals who Jesus is: God's Son. (See Matthew 3:13-17; Mark 1:9-11; Luke 3:21-22). Did you notice the Trinitarian manifestation? The Holy Spirit descended like a dove and the voice of the Father proclaimed Jesus as His beloved Son with whom He is well pleased. We received our Christian vocation in Baptism and deepened it with our Profession to participate in the life of the Trinity more fully.

The third manifestation is the Wedding at Cana (John 2:1-12). This is the first manifestation of Jesus' divine power, and it comes at the request of his mother when Jesus is apparently not ready to do that. What might this say about Mary as an intercessor? Is it any wonder that St. Francis chose her as the Patroness of the Franciscan Orders?

I hope that January may seem a little brighter now.
